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- **The Campus:** Covers nearly 80 acres
- **September 1974:** Groundbreaking for Dura-Bar plant
- **1976:** Woodstock, opened for business in 1976, first iron
- **1961:** Castwell Foundry
 - Dura-Bar 6 foot standard length story – based on room between end of barline and wall.



Dura-Bar Plant is approximately
400,000
SQUARE FEET

- **Truck Scale:** Newly added under Charter management
 - Control/verification of weight
 - Radiation detection
 - Rail Spur for raw scrap delivery



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

Continuous Cast Bar Animation


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- Working pond on-site
- Water cools barlines, furnaces, and holders
- 3.2 acres in size
- Holds 1.25 million gallons
- Pond is maintained chemically, (pH, algaecide, etc.)
- A closed system creating no environmental issues

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Solar is expected to power the production of

Dura-Bar officially began the shift to solar with power being drawn from an on-site solar farm – expected to be one of the largest in the state.
